REPORT

Constitution of the Committee

The Committee on Estimates for the year 1995 96 consisting of nine members was nominated by the Speaker on having been authorised by a motion moved and passed by the Haryana Vidhan Sabha in its sitting held on the 7th March, 1995 and notified vide Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat Notification No EC I/1995 96/29 dated 25th April 1995

Appointment of Chairman

- 2 Shri Suraj Mal M L A was appointed Chairman of the Committee

Sittings

- 3 The Committee held/fixed 47 sittings (at Chandigarh and outside Chandigarh) till the finalisation of this Report

Implementations/Recommendations

4 The Committee scrutinised the replies received from the Government in connection with the outstanding recommendations/observations of the Committee relating to the year 1985 86, 1987 88 1988 89 1989 90 1990 91, 1991 92, 1992 93 and 1994 95 pertaining to the Industries Town & Country Planning, Tourism Animal Husbandry Social Welfare, Forest, Transport and Co operation Departments The Committee dropped the recommendations/observations where it was satisfied with the action taken by the Government The observations of the Committee on the remaining recommendations/observations in respect of these Reports are contained in Appendix II to this Report

Selection of Departments

5 The Committee selected the following Departments with a view to scrutinise their Budget Estimates for the year 1995 96

- 1 P W D (Public Health)
- 2 Hospitality and
- 3 Excise and Taxation

Scrutinise/questionnaire

6 The Committee could not scrutinise/frame the questionnaire on the Budget material relating to the Hospitality and also could not examine the reply of the Excise and Taxation Departments for want of time

Scrutinise oral examination

7 The Committee scrutinised the material relating to the Budget Estimates for the year 1995 96 in respect of the Public Works (Public Health) Department and orally examined the representatives of the Department

Supplementary Estimates

8 The Committee also scrutinised the Supplementary Estimates of Haryana Government for the year 1995 96 and examined the representatives of the Finance Department as well as other Departments concerned with the demands and also prepared their report thereon for being presenting to the Vidhan Sabha on the date fixed therefor

General Observation Finance Department

9 The Committee while scrutinising the replies received from the Government relating to the pending paragraphs of the previous reports concerning these departments have experienced that the replies thereof are not being sent by various departments in time inspite of the instructions-issued by the Government from time to time

The Committee took a serious view and recommend that the Finance Department should coordinate in this respect and reiterate these instructions to all the concerned departments so that replies are sent in time in order to streamline the functioning of the Committee

10 The report of the Committee in respect of the Public Works (Public Health) Department is in the following paras

11 Functions, Aims and Objects of the Department

Adequate drinking water supply, sewerage and sanitation facilities are pre requisite to all the persons of the State. The P W (Public Health) Department is committed to provide adequate service to the people of the State.

Public Health Department of Haryana State is headed by an Engineer in Chief assisted by 3 Chief Engineers/Officer on special duty, 5 Superintending Engineers, 6 Executive Engineers and the CAO in the Head Office. In the field, there are 10 circles each headed by a Superintending Engineer. In all there are 38 working Divisions, besides this there are 2 Mechanical Divisions, one Design and Planning Division and one planning of Investigation Division. Each division is headed by an Executive Engineer.

The department is engaged in execution, operation and maintenance of water supply in rural sectors, water supply and Sewerage in Urban Sector, besides provision of operation and maintenance of sanitary installations in Government institutions and other deposit works. All the 6745 villages of the State (as per 1991 census) have been provided with facility of drinking water supply as on 31.3.1992. However on that date the rate of water supply in 2723 villages was less than the required norms of 40 LPCD. The main thrust before the department is to augment the water supply source in these villages and improving old distribution system under State Plan and Central Assistance under ARP. The work is also in hand for augmenting water at the rate of 70 LPCD in 6 desert prone districts of the State under Centrally Sponsored Desert Development Programme. All the water supply schemes which were earlier being maintained by the department for and on behalf of Panchayat department are now being maintained by the P W (Public Health) Department by providing separate budget to the department for maintaining these schemes without any recovery from beneficiaries w.e.f. 1993.

Urban Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Schemes are executed by the Public Health Department for and on behalf of Municipal Committees. Earlier some of the schemes were being maintained by the Local Bodies Department themselves which were later on transferred to the Public Health Department for maintenance of these schemes w.e.f. 2.4.1993 by providing a separate head for financing their maintenance cost.

One of the important schemes Yamuna Action Plan, has been taken in hand for providing interception and drainage alongwith complete sewerage treatment plants and other ancillary works in 6 towns of the State i.e. Yamuna Nagar—Jagadhri, Karnal, Panipat, Sonapat, Gurgaon and Faridabad. The Approximate cost of these schemes is Rs. 133.46 crores which will be borne equally by the Government of India and State Government with a facility of soft loan to the extent of 70% of the project cost to be paid back in 20 years.

For the year 1995-96 there is a target of improving water supply in 800 villages and extending water supply facility to 200 numbers source dharies having population more than 250 persons. Only skelton sewerage facility without treatment is available in 40 towns with service level of 35%. This service level is to be improved to 80%. In small towns only low cost sanitation facilities are to be provided whereas in big towns under ground sewerage facilities are provided. The target of improving service level is 3% every year.

The total budgetary allocation at the disposal of P W (Public Health) Department is Rs. 17099.35 lacs for the year 1995-96 for maintenance & execution of scheme/works in hand or to be taken in hand by the Department.

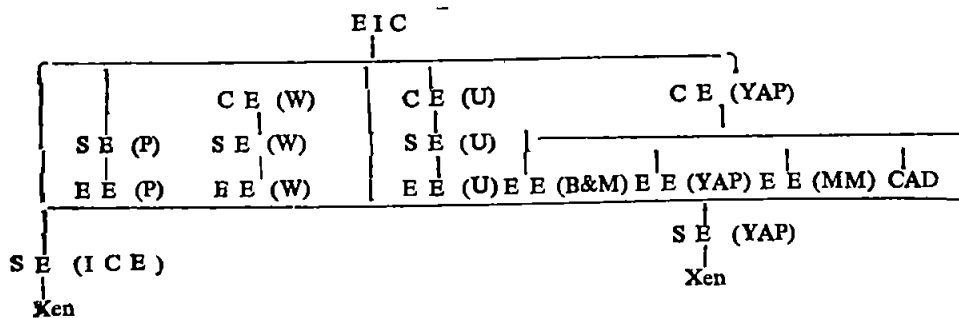

An in depth study of the budget estimates of the department was made by the Committee. Where after the Committee, during evidence of the representatives of the department asked for the detail of the schemes stated above. The representatives of the department replied as under —

“The details are not readily available with them and the same would be supplied to the Committee’

The Committee further sought clarification as to why the pace of expenditure of the funds allocated upto July 1995 is very slow. The representatives of the department stated as under —

The meeting of Sanitary Board is held after every six months. The funds allocated to the department could not be spent because some of the schemes are yet to be cleared/taken in hand’

On being further enquired, the Committee was informed as follows —

“Desert Development Programme is 75 percent centrally sponsored programme. Under this scheme the norms of water supply is 70 LPCD. 5 districts of the State i.e. Hisar Sirsa Bhiwani Rohtak Rewari and some parts of Mahendergarh are covered under this Programme”

While inquired about the amount spent on maintenance of various works/schemes it was replied that —

“A large amount of funds allocated for maintenance of various schemes of the department is spent on the establishment and electricity charges

For the desilting of water storage tanks special provision/estimate is prepared for maintenance purposes. The problem of silting the tanks arises after a period of 8 to 10 years. It was also assured by the department that all the tanks including that of Bahadurgarh (Rohtak district) where desilting work is required, the same will be done by sanctioning the money from MNP Head

The department also stated that at the time of desilting of the tanks people will have to face difficulty for drinking water because the water supply during that process will have to be discontinued. For that we will inform the people in advance and drinking water will be arranged to be supplied by tractor trolleys

Besides this the Committee made on the spot study tour of Rohtak and Bhiwani districts during the period from 9th to 12th January, 1996. The Committee visited various localities of Bahadurgarh town and some water works in surrounding areas. In Bhiwani district the Committee visited a number of water works. Detail of which has been given in one of the succeeding paras

During this on the spot study tour, the Committee observed that maintenance of various works/schemes was not as required. Besides this, the supply

of water was also not adequate. Of course, it was a fact that both these districts were flood affected and most of the works/schemes were damaged in 1995 floods.

The Committee concluded that it is a great task before the department to improve and restore proper water supply upto the standard norms by repairing the same. The department is also required to up keep the works of the sewerage/drainage system in various areas particularly where floods have caused damage.

(i) Therefore the Committee desire that the Headwise/Schemewise funds allocated to the department and spent during the year 1995-96 be supplied to the Committee.

(ii) The Committee further desire that the department should utilize the allocated funds within stipulated time. A strict monitoring be kept on the money being spent on various works.

(iii) The Committee further recommend that the Government to make sufficient amount of funds available for the repair/maintenance of all the water works and sewerage/drainage system etc.

(iv) The Committee further desire that the action taken in the matter as recommended above, be intimated to the Committee at the earliest.

14. Budgetary provision for Maintenance of Works /Schemes

The Committee wanted to know the reasons for not making the provision of sufficient fund in the budget for the maintenance of water works etc during the last financial year. The Department stated:

The work of maintaining Rural Water Supply Schemes as well as Urban Water Supply and Sewerage Schemes is done by the Public Health Department for and on behalf of Local Bodies. Upto 1992-93 funds for maintenance of Rural Water Supply Schemes were provided by the Government through the Budget of District Panchayat but were always short of actual requirements leading to accumulation of huge amount of arrears on this account. Similarly the Municipal Committees have not been paying the maintenance cost of Urban Water Supply and Sewerage Schemes for last so many years resulting in accumulation of huge arrears on this account. So the work of maintenance of all Urban Water Supply and Sewerage Schemes was transferred by the Government to the Department w.e.f. 4/93.

Though Government created separate head for providing funds for maintenance works of Rural Water Supply and Urban Water Supply in the budget of the Department but the funds made available have always been short of actual expenditure compelling the department to divert grants meant for original works to the maintenance works. Even after Government of India allowed diversion of 10% grant under MNP and ARP Rural Water Supply Schemes to maintenance Rural Water supply Schemes, the funds available were short of actual requirements.

As maintenance of these essential services cannot be stopped at any cost as such the department had to perforce resort to diversion of plan funds to maintenance works

The Committee have gone through the reply of the Department. Besides this the Committee have also undertook on the spot study tour during 9th to 12th January 1996 in the districts of Rohtak and Bhiwani of the following villages/cities

1 Bahadurgarh City

- (a) Mahavir Park Colony
- (b) Shanti Mandir Area,
- (c) Daya Nand Nagar across Jhajar Road,
- (d) Happy Child School Area,
- (e) Vasant Vihar
- (f) Dev Nagar etc

2 Villages

- (a) Jakhoda and Rohad (Rohtak District)
- (b) Bondh Sanjharwas Sanwar, Bamla Tigrana, Dhanana and Bapora in district Bhiwani

It was found that in most of the villages there was no adequate water supply. In most of the schemes the storage water tanks were found dry which were full of silt. On being enquired it was found that these water storage tanks have never been cleared/desilted. In most of the villages there was no water supply upto the tale. The position in villages particularly in Bondh and Bamla was not satisfactory. The villagers of these villages represented to the Committee that neither the supply of water is regular and smooth nor the water being supplied for drinking purposes, is worth drinking. It was further stated that for the last so many months there is no proper water supply in the entire villages and most of the areas of the villages remain without water. The local officers accompanied the Committee also admitted this fact.

It was also brought to the notice of the Committee that the water courses near villages which are used for the water supply from canals to the storage tanks are being misused by the villagers for bathing, washing of clothes and bathing of cattles etc because the same are opened.

The Committee concluded that a lot is required to be done by the Department. Effective steps should be taken to repair damaged schemes/works. Water storage tanks, which are full of silt should be cleaned/desilted. However in most of the tanks work was in progress and the officers assured that the desilting work would be completed within a fortnight or so. At most of the water works, the work of construction of boundary walls was

also in progress. It was also felt that boundary wall is must to safeguard the drinking water. Though the filter system in water ponds was not deplorable, yet it was not upto the norms as noted by the Committee. In village Jakhoda the water storage tanks were found damaged and there was a leakage of water. These tanks required immediate repair. In some of the villages water supply can be regulated if the villages are divided in more Zones. It was also observed that for smooth supply of water the practice of installing unauthorised water connections should be checked /curbed. In some of the villages like Barahi etc damaged pipe lines are required to be repaired.

At some of the water works over head water tanks were lying abandoned. The Committee was informed that the same are not in use for the last so many years. The Committee was surprised to note this fact because a huge amount of funds was spent on their construction.

Besides this much has to be done in the field of sewerage/drainage system. It has been observed that some of these schemes are not functioning properly. At Bahadurgarh in most of the Colonies, visited by the Committee this system is about to collapse. It was a general complaint of the people of Bahadurgarh that the drainage system in the town has not been planned systematically. The Committee is of the opinion that special attention is required to be given to these works in all the towns particularly at Bahadurgarh.

Therefore, the Committee is of the opinion that the department to ascertain the work/schemes where action is required to be taken as recommended below --

- (i) The department to take urgent steps to cover the water courses/canals near the villages to stop misuse of drinking water.
- (ii) The department may take effective steps for the repair to and maintenance of water works to make drinking water available as per norms.
- (iii) The department to take steps for the construction of boundary walls at water works.
- (iv) The department to take effective steps to curb the practice of installing unauthorised water connections which are the main constraints in smooth water supply.
- (v) Filter system in the water tanks should be as per norms fixed.
- (vi) For smooth water supply villages be divided into more zones.
- (vii) The Committee desired and strongly recommended that all the aspects with foresightedness should be taken into consideration before finalising any new scheme. At some of the water works over head water tanks are found abandoned.
- (viii) The Committee may be informed about the action taken as recommended above.

The Committee have gone through the reply of the department and also took evidence of the representatives of the department. During evidence the committee observed that a heavy amount of fund is being spent on the maintenance/repair of the vehicles. The committee desired to know the reasons there for.

The Financial Commissioner & Secretary admitted that it is a fact. It was further stated that there has been no replacement of old (condemnable) vehicles for the last many years in the department. This resulted in heavy expenditure on maintenance/repair.

On being asked as to what steps are being taken to curb this huge expenditure it was further stated that

Now we are taking steps to replace condemnable vehicles every year. Some of the vehicles would be replaced by April, 1996.

The Committee reached the conclusion that the department is having a large fleet of unserviceable vehicles. A perusal of the information given above, shows that there is extravagant on the maintenance of old vehicles. The expenditure of some of the vehicles exceeds lacs of rupees in a year. The Committee have pains to note this fact and are of the view that Government is not vigilant in this regard. It looks that in some of the cases the expenditure in a year is more or less, equal to the cost of a new vehicle. The Committee observe that this expenditure can be avoided in case the old vehicles are replaced. The performance of these vehicles definitely affects the pace of working of the department. This expenditure proves that the idea of not replacing the old vehicles with a view to effect economy is forfeited. The Committee further gained momentum in this regard, from the following reply of the department.

However as per col 4 above most of the vehicles are in condemnable conditions but are still in use for want of replacement

The overaged and inefficient vehicles, involving high maintenance and operating cost are main problem/bottlenecks before the department. With a view to avoid huge expenditure the Committee strongly recommend to the Government that urgent effective steps be taken to replace old/condemnable vehicles without delay.

The Committee further desire that the action taken in the matter be intimated to the Committee.

16 Utilisation of Funds

A detail of the fund allocated to the department for various works/schemes during the last three years has been given in the following table. From the perusal of the detail the Committee noted that there is a variation in the amount of expenditure and the amount allocated for certain works.

During evidence, the Committee sought an explanation as to under what circumstances the Department was not in a position to utilize the entire fund allocated to them. It seems that the department was not serious about it.

Engineer in Chief replied as follows —

The allocation of funds is of two types. One is for the Government works and the other for maintenance. In the year 1992-93 the funds had been allocated but some of the works could not be taken in hand. He further stated that there is no such work with us which can be undertaken independently. For example in case of supply of water we have to make contacts to the Irrigation Department. In case of supply of Electricity we have to make contacts to the HSEB.

On being dissatisfied with this reply the Committee asked to know any circumstances as an example which led the department for not utilizing the entire amount allocated for the Government works etc.

The Financial Commissioner & Secretary to Government (P H Deptt) replied that —

‘The department faced great financial constraints during the year 1992-93. Some of the works have been completed but payments could not be made. Pending Bills were cleared during the month of April—June (next financial year). It was the reason that expenditure under the Head Maintenance of Rural Water Supply was Rs. 1791.65 lacs against allocated amount of Rs. 2253 lacs. It took three months but we got no sanction and we had to keep the bills pending. Same position remained in the year 1994-95. The Funds of maintenance had to be reduced as the same were used in flood affected works.

After hearing the departmental representatives the Committee satisfied with the replies and decided not to pursue this question further, with the direction that the department should make efforts, in future, to utilize the entire fund allocated by the Government, in the same year.

17 Yamuna Action Plan

In reply to the questionnaire of the Committee the department submitted the following written reply:

To stop pollution of Yamuna river and connected Yamuna Canal system on which a number of water supply schemes are based sewage treatment plants under Yamuna Action Plan are being provided in six towns of the State at a total

Work on 14 out of 35 sewer works has started in right earnest. Consultants have been appointed to submit detailed designs and estimates of sewage treatment works. Besides the work on electric crematoria and bathing ghats at Yamuna Nagar is also completed. Entire project work is proposed to be completed by 1997.

During the evidence the departmental representatives replied as under

Yamuna Action Plan is a big project. Under this plan besides other schemes sewerage treatment plant shall also be established. It would be the first plant in Haryana. These are the items on which a huge expenditure is to be incurred. Haryana State have deposited their share. Equal amount is to be released by the Government of India.

On being inquired by the Committee whether there is any scheme under consideration of the Government to include certain other towns like Radaur etc. under this scheme. The representatives of the department stated as under —

No other cities have been included in this plan so far. One case regarding Radaur and Indri etc. is pending in the Hon. Supreme Court. After the decision of this case the Government may consider to include some of the towns under this plan.

After going through the reply and the evidence of the department, the Committee noted that it is a big and important plan. It covers important cities/towns adjoining the Yamuna River. The beneficiaries from this plan are inhabitants of Haryana State. The department should remain active/vigilant in supervising the various works/schemes for their early completion.

The Committee, therefore, recommends that the progress made in the completion of various works/schemes under this plan be intimated to the Committee.

The Committee further desires that the detail of new works, if any, taken in hand be intimated to the Committee.

The Committee also desires to send the detail of the Court Case along with the latest position.

18 / Schemes for the Benefit of the People

In written reply to the Questionnaire of the Committee the Govt. stated that the State of Haryana has provided piped water supply to all the inhabited villages by 31-3-1992 and the objective during the 8th Five year plan is to augment water supply level in 2723 deficient villages to the approved norms of 40 LPCD. During the first three years of the 8th Five years plan 1754 villages have been augmented and the target for the current year 1995-96 is 800 villages and out of these 122 villages stand improved upto 31-7-1995. All the 2723 villages are proposed to be augmented to the desired level of 40 LPCD by the end of 8th Five Years Plan.

Water supply has been provided in all the 80 Municipal towns in the State Skelton sewerage system has been provided in 40 towns and sewerage schemes are under implementation in other 4 towns

During the oral examination the departmental representatives informed the Committee that in most of the villages water supply is not being maintained upto the norms because of the reasons that some of the schemes are 20 years old and the population has been increased manifold It was also replied that in about 60—70 villages no adequate water supply is available from the canals The Committee made a query to know any single village where water reaches at the tale The reply is as under

Certain schemes have been identified where no water is supplied throughout the year We are considering alternative arrangements for them

The Committee Commented that during the peak summer season there remain acute shortage of drinking water Most of the canals remain dried Water is available in the record of the department but in fact no water is available in the canals during the summer season

(i) Therefore, the Committee desired that department to take effective steps to augment water supply upto the proposed norms in all villages of the State, as stated by the department under intimation to the Committee

(ii) The Committee was also informed by the departmental representatives that in most of the villages there is no water supply throughout the year and the Government is considering other alternative arrangements to provide drinking water to those villages The Committee desired that the action taken in this regard be intimated to the Committee at the earliest

(iii) The Committee also desired to know the names of 4 towns where the sewerage schemes are under implementation The progress made in this regard may also be intimated to the Committee

After going through the replies of the department the Committee agreed with the justification given by the department regarding vacancies of Executive Engineer and Assistant Engineer/Sub Divisional Engineers. The Committee enquired about the reasons for not filling up the posts of Junior Engineers. The representatives of the department replied as under —

Some of the posts of Junior Engineers have been taken from the MITC. Some more incumbents of these vacant posts are also expected from there. In case our requirements do not fulfil from MITC then we will send a requisition to the S S S Board to recommend names. It was also replied that it is a continuous process as the posts become vacant due to the retirement/death, resignation and sanction of additional posts etc.

The Committee further sought clarification for not filling up the posts of clerks etc. lying vacant in the Head office as well as in the field offices. The representatives of the department replied as follows

'Requisition to fill up some of the posts has been sent to S S S Board. As soon as the recommendation of candidates is received from the Board, posts shall be filled. It was further stated that no direct recruitment is made to the posts of Clerks. On being further inquired, it was replied that a requisition for all the posts as are vacant up to 31.12.95 shall be sent to the S S S Board for selection and recommending the candidates to this department. The S S S Board shall also be pursued to expedite the matter.

In another question the Committee expressed their opinion that Tubewell Operators on water works are appointed for 30/60 days basis. After that their services are removed/terminated and the operators are reappointed. It creates a problem for the departmental officers as also the public representatives (MLAs). The people of the State also face problem on account of temporary operators as it affects the functioning of the water works. The reply of the department is as under —

The department is agreed with the observation of the Committee. But the Finance Department have imposed a ban to make fresh recruitment to effect economy. In view of this the work charged employees are removed before the completion of specified time. At the same time the Finance Department have denied the sanction for creation of new posts. Therefore it was decided to post one employee (Tubewell Operator) at 2/3 water works.

The Committee further commented that the duties of an operator is of such a nature that it is difficult for him to attend 2/3 water works at different places having distance of 4—5 Kms. It is a different case in respect of Helpers, Fitters or Mechanics etc. who can look after the work at various places. But in case the Pump/Tubewell Operator is posted as decided by the department, it may virtually be a failure of the working of water works. The Engineer-in-Chief replied as under —

"We will re-examine this matter. We are also in touch with the Finance Department."

The Committee further sought the opinion of the Financial Commissioner and Secretary, Public Health Department, who stated that I am also of the same opinion

The Committee concluded that most of the posts having important role are lying vacant in the department. The tubewells/water pumps have an important function for smooth water supply. Any work can be looked after/maintained properly only if a regular/permanent employee is made incharge. A regular employee will feel his responsibilities better. In the present arrangement there remains uncertainty about the continuance in service in the mind of such employees. Certainly it is difficult for a person to operate/look after 2/3 schemes at a distance of 4/5 Kms or so. Besides this his presence/availability on duty also becomes difficult to be checked.

(i) Therefore, the Committee recommend that the department to take steps to fill up the vacant posts as lying vacant on 31-12-95 in the department (at Headquarter and in the field offices)

(ii) The Committee further recommend that with a view to avoid inconvenience to the people of the State the department to take up the matter with the Government (Finance Department) to get the posts of Tubewell/Pump Operators sanctioned so that a regular employee be posted at water works with full responsibility.

(iii) The Committee further desire that the action taken in these matters, as recommended above be intimated to the Committee at the earliest.

20 Complaints/Embezzlement/Irregularities

P W (P H) Deptt is an expanding deptt. Various small and big works/schemes are in hand of the department. The department is required to maintain/up keep the norms/standard of those works and for that a constant check on the utilization of funds and working of the subordinate offices is imperative.

On being asked by the Committee, the Deptt supplied the detail of the cases pertaining to the complaints etc detected during the last three years. The reply is as follows.

Further during evidence to a question as to why for such a long time these cases have not been finalized and action taken against the officer/officials who are at fault the Financial Commissioner & Secretary replied that

In such type of cases reminders are issued. However latest position of these cases will be submitted to the Committee

On being asked to submit the reply within fortnight Engineer in-Chief sought more time and assured to submit the reply by 31st January 1996 which was agreed to by the Committee

In response to another query the representative of the Deptt stated as under —

The full report/reply to the questionnaire is still awaited. But the complete list of all complaints has been supplied. So far as the query regarding the amount involved in these cases separately is concerned the same will be supplied to the Committee.

The Committee concluded that the progress made in finalizing these cases is very slow. It seems that the Deptt is not serious in this regard. In some of the cases the action is required to be taken by the Deptt themselves. Even though no final decision has been taken for a long time. The departmental representatives as assured have not supplied the report till the finalization of this report. The Committee has taken a serious view of it.

The Committee, therefore, desired the Deptt to expedite and finalize the cases at the earliest, along with the action taken against the officers/officials who are at fault.

The Committee further desired to intimate the amount involved in each case.

In their reply the Deptt stated that a large number of cases (service matters embezzlement etc) are pending in various courts. They are thousands in number.

During evidence the Committee observed that this question relates to the complaints etc. Therefore the Deptt is required to submit the detail of such type of cases only.

The departmental representatives agreed to send the reply accordingly.

The Committee, therefore, desired that the detail of the cases relating to embezzlement/complaints etc, which are pending in various courts along with the amount involved be sent to the Committee.

21 Publicity

In their written reply to the questionnaire of the Committee and during oral examination the departmental representatives stated that there is no regular scheme for the publication of literatures in hand of the Deptt. It was also informed that at the time of public functions publicity is made about the schemes of

deptt through circulation of pamphlets. There is one regular scheme named Information and Education Communication Cell which has been sanctioned by the Government of India. This scheme is sponsored by Govt of India. Under this scheme the people of State shall be imparted knowledge about the schemes and their importance etc.

The departmental representatives were agreed to the suggestion made by the Committee to make publicity at the Block/Panchayat Samiti Level also. During on the spot study in January 1996 the Committee noted that there was misuse of drinking water at large scale. In these circumstances the publicity has its own importance.

The Committee, therefore, desired to take steps to implement this scheme under intimation to the Committee.

22 Physical Verification of stocks

On being asked by the Committee the reply of the Deptt to a questionnaire of the Committee is as under —

Physical verification of stores and MAS is done every year regularly. Duty of Sub Divisional Engineers are assigned by Superintending Engineers to check other Sub Divisional Engineers within the Circle.

During evidence, the Committee was informed as under —

One S D O is deputed to verify the stocks pertaining to the other Sub Division/Division.

On a further query made by the Committee the F C & Secretary stated that the present system of checking is viable and the Deptt is not facing any problem.

On a suggestion made by the Committee the F C & Secretary agreed to issue instructions for making surprise inspection/checking by the Xens level also.

After hearing the departmental representatives the Committee desired that the surprise inspection/physical verification be made by the officer of the level of Executive Engineer, as agreed to, by the departmental representatives during evidence. The Committee further desired that the action taken in the matter be intimated to the Committee.

23 Losses in Stocks/Stores

In reply to the questionnaire of the Committee, the Govt supplied the information with regard to the losses detected in the stores of the department as under —

After going through the reply submitted by the department and after oral examinations of the departmental representatives, the Committee observed that most of the cases are 3—4 years old. The Committee distressed to note that the action, which is required to be taken by the department has not been taken for such a long time.

The Committee, therefore, recommend that the action to finalize the matters be expedited and action against the defaulters be also taken under intimation to the Committee.

24 Complaint Regarding use of Low Standard Building Material

In reply to the questionnaire of the Committee the departmental representatives stated that there is no complaint regarding purchase/use of low standard machinery/material during the last three years and the information in this regard is nil.

However during the oral examination of the departmental representatives the Committee observed that in most of the water works like Bond in District Bhiwani the building material of low standard is being used for the repair/construction of water works. In reply thereto the department assured the Committee as under —

If it is so the matter will be looked into and necessary action will be taken to stop the use of low standard material.

The Committee therefore desire that the action taken in the matter be intimated to the Committee at the earliest.

In reply to the questionnaire of the Committee the department supplied the information as follows —

During the oral examination to a query made by the Committee the reply of the Deptt was as under —

In all the cases stated above an excess payment was made to the contractors by the Officers/officials concerned. In most of the cases action has been taken and the cases will be decided as early as possible. It was further stated that the services of a J E Sh I C Verma have been terminated. A sum of about Rs 3 lacs is to be recovered from him and the matter of recovery is under process. It was further informed that this case pertains to the year 1987-88 and all the officers involved have been charged sheeted.

The Committee further desired to know whether any of these officers/officials have been promoted. The reply of the Deptt was as under

'Sh R S Sharma the then Xen has been promoted as S E. But he was not directly involved in this case. The SDO/JEs are responsible to issue or to receive the stock materials. So far as the question of promotion is concerned, this fact came to the notice of authorities after his promotion.

On being pointed out by the Committee that Xen concerned is also responsible for this lapse the explanation of the E I C is as under —

It is agreed, Overall responsibility is of the Xen. Keeping in view of this fact show cause notice was issued to him. He was also issued warning.

On being enquired by the Committee the Deptt representatives assured to finalise the matter within a month or two including the action against the defaulting officers.

The Committee concluded that the irregularity was made possible due to the negligence of the senior officers. The Committee has earlier recommended to make checking system more effective. Had it been verified properly during the stock verification by a responsible officer, the same irregularity could have been avoided. Therefore, the Committee further is of the opinion that to avoid any irregularity in stocks, use of sub standard material, misuse of fund etc., surprise checking by the senior officer like Xen, etc is imperative.

Therefore, the Committee desired that the cases be decided at the earliest alongwith the action taken against the officers/officials who are at fault (stated above at 'a')

The Committee further desired that the cases as stated at 'b' above be settled at the earliest.

The Committee be also intimated about the action taken in the matter.

26 Sewerage facilities in Rural Areas

In reply to the questionnaire the reply of the department regarding sewerage facilities in rural areas is as follows

At present no sewerage scheme are being implemented in the rural areas except in village Adampur with funds from HRDF due to prohibitive cost of laying of sewerage system. However there is a proposal to provide drainage facility in big villages and a start has been made in this direction during the current financial year and a sum of Rs 200 lakhs has been allocated for this purpose. Work is likely to be taken in hand very shortly.

To provide better sewerage facility in Urban areas the Department has formulated 7 new sewerage and storm water drainage schemes costing Rs 54.90 lakhs for expending the sewerage facilities repairing and replacing damaged existing sewers pumping machinery sullage carriers disposal works etc. In addition an integrated project covering sewerage schemes for 22 towns at a cost of Rs 501.00 crores has been formulated and is under consideration with Asian Development Bank for financial assistance.

During evidence the departmental representatives stated as under

Some of the big villages like Kalanaur and Behlana in district Rohtak, Babyal and Balana in Ambala, Nissing in Karnal, Adampur and Mohammadpur in Hissar district have been covered under this scheme.

The Committee further desired to know the criteria adopted for adopting the villages, under this scheme. The departmental representative replied as under —

The decision is taken on the basis of population. Villages having population of 5-10 thousands have been taken under this scheme and the decision was taken accordingly. Other villages will also be included in this scheme on the availability of funds.

For another query made by the Committee it was intimated by the representative that no time limit can be fixed to provide sewerage/drainage facilities in rural areas. The main constraints for which are non-availability of sufficient funds and the development of new colonies in the towns/cities.

Regarding Integrated Project Covering Sewerage Scheme for 22 towns at a cost of Rs 501 crores it was intimated that it is a proposal of the Govt.

After evidence of departmental representatives, the Committee desired that the latest progress made for providing drainage/sewerage facilities in big villages as stated above, be intimated to the Committee.

The Committee further desired that the progress made in the implementation of IPCSS for 22 towns be also intimated to the Committee

27 Vigilance Cell

In reply to the questionnaire regarding keeping a vigil on the working of the department it was informed to the Committee that Chief Engineer (Urban) has been appointed as Chief Vigilance Officer and all Superintending Engineers in the field have been appointed as Vigilance Officers, with respect to their circles for keeping a vigil on the working of the department

The Committee is of the opinion that a large number of schemes are executed by the department. To avoid any irregularity in the use of building material, stores material etc the department should keep a constant check on the working of the department

Therefore, the Committee desired that the action taken in this regard be intimated to the Committee

28 Works in hand with the department

During oral examination to a query the reply of the Department stated that —

Work on most of these schemes is in progress

On a further inquiry as to what action is being taken, the Engineer in Chief stated,

40 New Taps are being installed in certain villages and the problem of some of the villages will be over there after

The Committee distressed to note that a large number of water supply schemes are not functioning at present due to the reasons stated by the department. The Committee also noted that a huge amount has been spent on these schemes but the people of the state are not getting benefit of it.

The Committee desired that concrete steps be taken by the department to start these schemes and the Committee be kept informed about the progress made in this regard.

30 Overhead water tanks/water works

In reply to the questionnaire regarding construction of over-head water tanks in the State particularly in Government High School Jorasi Khalsa (Snalkha Block) the department replied that the DNIT for the construction of OHSR in village Jorasi Khalsa (Panipat) has been approved by the Engineer in Chief Haryana P.W. (Public Health) Department on 5.9.95 and the work will be taken in hand after calling the tenders.

During the oral examination it was also stated that the funds for the construction of certain other over head water tanks like at Bahadurgarh shall also be made available to the department.

The Committee, therefore, desired that the action be expedited to complete these works. The Committee further desired that the latest progress of the works be intimated to the Committee.

31 Private/Domestic connections

The requirement of drinking water is a great necessity in the State like Haryana. Every citizen expects to have this facility at his door steps. Therefore they demand for a separate water connection/water tap. In reply to the questionnaire on the subject the department submitted reply as under

At present domestic private water connections are not being encouraged. However water connections are released only in such cases where the per capita supply in villages is at least 70 LPCD and adequate drainage facilities are in existence. Such domestic water connections are sanctioned after approval of Honble Chief Minister.

During evidence it was informed that Rs 1000 is charged from the person who get water connection Thereafter rent for water supply is Charged monthly

During on the spot study tour the Committee noticed that one of the problems in regulating smooth water supply is the installation of large number of water connections/taps - Some of these connections stated to have been installed unauthorisedly On account of it the water do not reach up to the tale The Committee observe that this practice should be curtailed/checked If necessary penalty be imposed for the unauthorised connections

Therefore, the Committee desire that the practice of installation of unauthorised water connections/taps be discouraged strictly The new water connections/taps be provided according to the availability of water and strictly according to norms The local officers should also make the people aware about it

The Committee further desire that the action taken in the matter be intimated to the Committee

32 Water Taps in Harijan Basties

In their reply to the questionnaire it was stated that these schemes are formulated for the entire Community irrespective of any caste discrimination However stand posts are provided in Harijan Basti as per norms as and when any new Harijan Basti comes up

The Committee enquired the norms fixed by the Department to provide water taps and reply is as under —

Earlier the norm was one stand post for 200 persons Now the norm has been fixed one stand post for 100 persons

The Committee pointed out that in certain Harijan Basties of villages like Sanjorwas Mundhal (North area) etc in Bhiwani District, no single water tap has been provided The entire Committee was of the same opinion regarding this problem in most of the areas

The Committee, therefore, desired that according to the norms water taps/stand posts be provided in such Harijan Basties where required, under intimation to the Committee
