Constitution of the Committee

1 The Committee on Estimates for the year 2011-2012 consisting of nine members was nominated by the Hon ble Speaker on having been authorized by a motion moved and passed by the Haryana Vidhan Sabha in its sitting held on 7th March 2011 and notified vide Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat Notification No EC I/2011-12/28 dated 28th April 2011

Appointment of Chairpersons

2 Rao Dharam Pal M L A was appointed the Chairperson of the Committee

Sittings

3 The Committee held/fixed 70 meetings (at Chandigarh and outside Chandigarh) till the finalization of this Report

Implementations/Recommendations

4 The Committee scrutinized the replies received from the Government in connection with the outstanding recommendations/observations made in their reports for the year 1995-96 1996-97 1998-99 2000-01 2001-02 2003-04 2006-07 2007-08 2008-09 and 2010-11 pertaining to Public Health Engineering Health Mines & Geology Tourism Excise & Taxation Environment Development & Panchayats Rural Development Industries & Commerce Welfare of SC s & BC s Tourism and Excise and Taxation Departments. The Committee dropped the recommendations/observations where it was satisfied with the action taken by the Government. The observations to the Committee of the remaining recommendations/observations in respect of these reports are contained in Appendix II of this Report

6 The Committee took a serious view for not supplying the Material on the Budget Estimates for the year 2011-2012 by the Public Works (B & R) and Health Departments. **The Committee recommends that appropriate action be taken against the concerned Officers of the Public Works (B&R) and Health Departments who are responsible for it**

7 The Committee scrutinized the material and framed the questionnaire in respect of the Environment Public Health Engineering Irrigation and Public Health Engineering Departments for the year 2011-2012 and orally examined the Financial Commissioner/Commissioner & Principal Secretary/Secretary to Government Haryana Public Health Engineering Department

Supplementary Estimates

8 The Committee also scrutinized the Supplementary Estimates of Haryana Government for the year 2011-2012 and examined the representative of the Finance Department as well as other Departments concerned with the demands and also prepared their reports thereon for being presented to the Vidhan Sabha on the date fixed therefore

General Observation Finance Department

9 The Committee while scrutinizing the replies received from the Government relating to the Departments pending paragraphs of previous reports concerning these Departments have experienced that the replies thereof are not being sent by some of the departments in time inspite of the instructions issued by the Government from time to time

The Committee is of the view that **the Finance Department should coordinate in this respect and reiterate these instructions to all the concerned Departments so that replies are sent in time in order to streamline the functioning of the Committee**

2 Functions of the Department & its subordinate offices

The department is engaged in execution operation and maintenance of water supply in rural sectors water supply and sewerage in urban sector besides provision of operation and maintenance of sanitary installations in Government institutions and other deposit works

5 Drinking Water Facilities

The Department was asked by the Committee whether there is any village/town/part of any city which has not been provided the drinking water facilities

In the reply to the questionnaire of the Committee the department submitted that all the villages/towns have been provided with drinking water facilities. But during the course of oral examination it came into the notice of the Committee that there are such Dhanies where water facility has not been provided. **Therefore, the Committee desired to know full details of the number of such Dhanies which have requested for providing the drinking water along with the numbers of such Dhanies to which the drinking water has not been made available even after their request**

6 Embezzlement/Misappropriation/Irregularities of Funds

On being asked by the Committee regarding —

- (a) The number of complaints received and enquiry conducted regarding irregularities/embezzlements/misappropriation of funds against the officers/officials of the department during the last three years together with the action taken by the department against them who have been found at fault with the latest position thereof and

On the basis of findings in the enquiry report of above stated 19 no complaints 4 no complaints have been filed and disciplinary action against the defaulting officers/officials is in progress in the remaining 15 no complaints
