REPORT

Constitution of the Committee

1 The Committee on Estimates for the year 2012-2013 consisting of nine members was nominated by the Hon ble Speaker on having been authorized by a motion moved and passed by the Haryana Vidhan Sabha in its sitting held on 24th February 2012 and notified *vide* Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat Notification No EC I/2012-13/28 dated 24th April 2012

Appointment of Chairperson

2 Rao Dharam Pal M L A was appointed the Chairperson of the Committee

Sittings

3 The Committee held 69 meetings (at Chandigarh and outside Chandigarh) till the finalization of this Report

Implementations/Recommendations

4 The Committee scrutinized the replies received from the Government in connection with the outstanding recommendations/observations made in their reports for the year 1995-96 1996-97 1998-99 2000-01 2001-02 2003-04 2006-07 2007-08 2008-09 and 2010-11 pertaining to Public Health Engineering Health Mines & Geology Tourism Excise & Taxation Environment Development & Panchayats Rural Development Industries & Commerce Welfare of SC s & BC s Tourism and Excise & Taxation Departments The Committee dropped the recommendations/observations where it was satisfied with the action taken by the Government The observations to the Committee of the remaining recommendations/observations in respect of these reports are contained in Appendix II of this Report

Selection of Departments

5 The Committee Selected the following Departments with a view to scrutinize their Budget Estimates for the year 2011-2012 and 2012-2013

2011-2012

- 1 Irrigation Department
- 2 Environment Department

2012-2013

- 1 Health Department
- 2 Public Works (B&R) Department

Scrutiny/Framing of Questionnaire/Oral Examination

6 The Committee scrutinized the material and framed the questionnaire in respect of the Environment and Irrigation Departments for the year 2011-2012 and orally examined the Irrigation Department But could not orally examined the representatives of the Environment Department due to paucity of time

7 The Committee also could not frame the questionnaire on the budget material relating to Public Works (B&R) Department due to paucity of time

8 As already recommended by the Committee on Estimates in its 40th Report for the year 2011-12 **that appropriate action be taken against the concerned Officers of the Health Department who are responsible for not supplying the material on the budget estimates for the year 2011-12** Now the committee has again selected the Health Department with a view to scrutinize their Budget Estimates for the year 2012 2013 but the department has again failed to supply the material on the budget estimates for the year 2012 2013 The committee therefore took a serious view on the matter and **again recommends that appropriate action be taken against the concerned Officers of the Department who are responsible for not supplying the material as recommended by the Committee**

Supplementary Estimates

9 The Committee also scrutinized the Supplementary Estimates of Haryana Government for the year 2012-2013 and examined the representative of the Finance Department as well as other Departments concerned with the demands and also prepared their report thereon for being presented to the Vidhan Sabha on the date fixed therefore

General Observation Finance Department

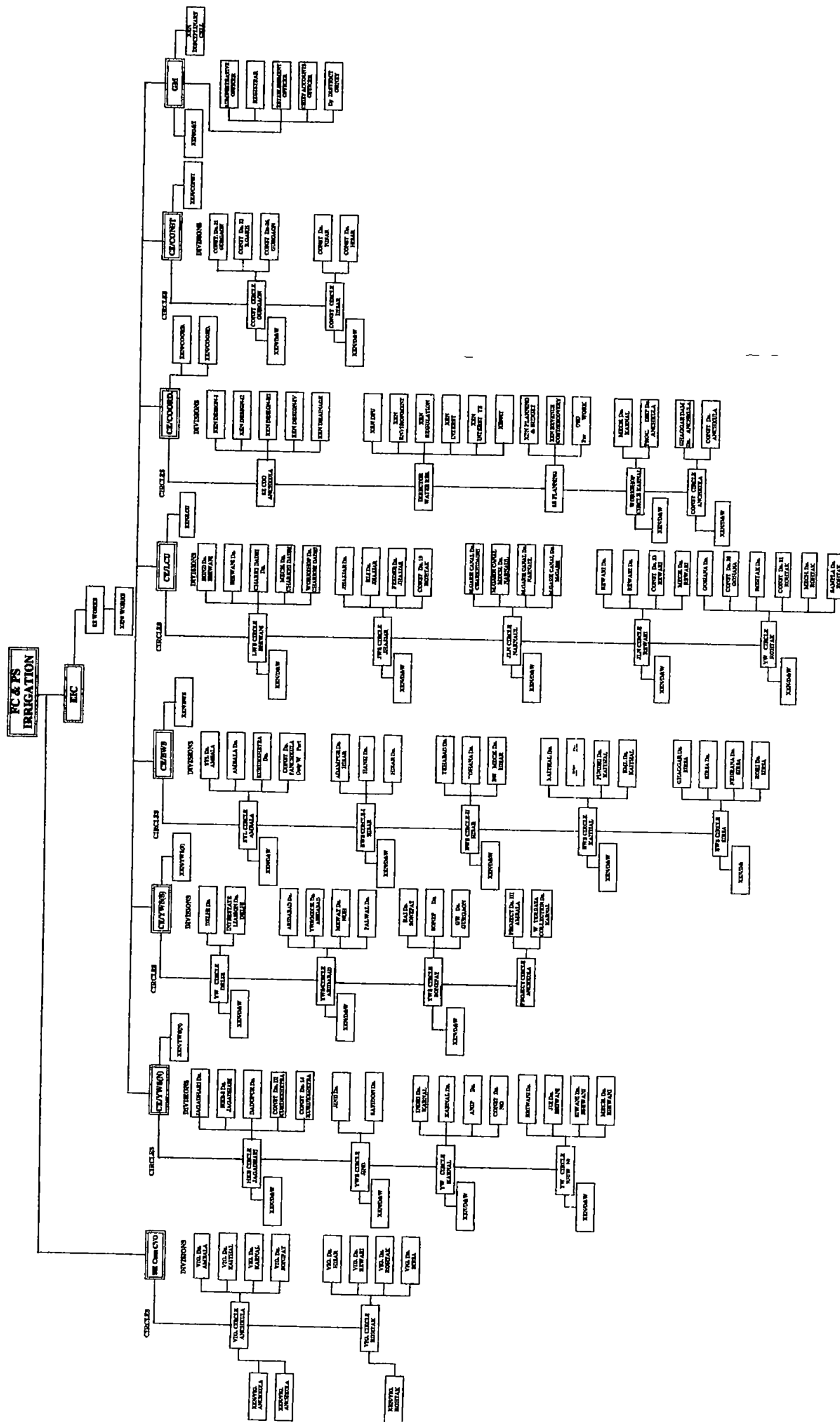
10 The Committee while scrutinizing the replies received from the Government relating to the Departments pending paragraphs of previous reports concerning these Departments have experienced that the replies thereof are not being sent by some of the departments in time inspite of the instructions issued by the Government from time to time

The Committee is of the view that **the Finance Department should coordinate in this respect and reiterate these instructions to all the concerned Departments so that replies are sent in time in order to streamline the functioning of the Committee**

Haryana Irrigation system has been designed for 62% irrigation intensity and the unit wise irrigation intensity achieved is as under

- Yamuna Water Services System – 62.8%
- Bhakra Water Services System – 92%
- Lift Canal System - 18%

Full intensity of irrigation has been achieved for Yamuna Water Services System Intensity of irrigation for Bhakra Water Services System has been achieved more than the designed capacity due to sufficient availability of Bhakra waters Intensity of irrigation for Lift Canal System is very less due to non receipt of SYL Water and incompleton of Bhakar Main Line Hansi Branch Butana Branch Multipurpose Link Channel Efforts are being made to improve the intensity of irrigation in lift areas by the rehabilitation of pump houses

construction of new watercourses by CADA and rehabilitation of watercourses by Haryana Irrigation Department and by doing chakbandi

After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representatives of the Department **the Committee recommends that the list of projects pending for providing water to the Public Health Engineering Department for supplying drinking water to the villages/towns and cities till 1 7-2012 may be supplied to the Committee**

10 Scheme for Water to Industrial Sectors

The Department was asked by the Committee to supply the details of various schemes pending for providing the water to the Industries since last three years

The Department reply is as under

After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representatives of the Department **the Committee recommends that the list of industries where the water is being provided by the department and also list of industries whose demand for water is pending may be supplied to the Committee Thereafter the Committee will conduct on spot study/visit**

11 Water to Water Bodies

The Department was asked by the Committee whether the Irrigation Department is providing sufficient water to the various water bodies thereby improving ecology and tourism if not the reasons thereof The Committee would also like to know the details of projects since last three years

In the reply to the questionnaire of the Committee the Department submitted that the Haryana Irrigation Department is supplying sufficient water to various water bodies such as Rani Talab Jind Tilyar Lake Rohtak and Karan Lake Karnal At present no scheme is pending for supplying water to the water bodies

But during the oral examination a point regarding Sultanpur Lake came to the notice of the Committee on Estimates **Therefore, the Committee desired to know, whether water is being provided to the Sultanpur Lake if so, by which canal the water is being provided to this Lake**

12 Flood Control/Drainage

On being asked by the Committee —

Whether the department has taken any steps to control the floods if so, the details thereof

The Department replied as under —

Haryana State is alive to the requirement of control of floods and it has taken many steps to control the flood. It has spent huge sums of money on flood control works. Year wise expenditure incurred on flood works for the last three years as under

Apart from flood works on River Yamuna & Ghaggar Department has also constructed a network of drains, protection bunds and embankments.

At present following flood control and drainage works are in position —

A	Length of drains	= 4950 KM
B	Length of embankments	= 1275 KM
C	Number of villages/towns protected through bunds/embankments	= 800 Nos

This year expenditure incurred on flood control works is over Rs. 230 crores from January 2011 to November 2011. In addition to it a project costing to Rs. 171.30 crores has been got sanctioned from Ganga Flood Control Commission for flood management works on river Yamuna. Out of which about Rs. 110 crores have already been spent on this work. Rest works are going on.

Moreover every year flood control schemes are approved for every district by Haryana State Flood Control Board (HSFCB) to control the floods. The Haryana State Flood Control Board in its meeting held on 27.01.2011 has approved 252 new schemes amounting to Rs. 664.4 crores and 103 on going schemes amounting to Rs. 157.00 crores for flood control and drainage works. Out of which 95 No. new schemes and 28 No. on going schemes have been completed so far.

De-watering pumps are used to drain out the flood water from the fields.

15 Pollution in water bodies

The Department was asked by the Committee regarding the details of steps taken by the department during the last three years to check the pollution in rivers canals and water bodies etc together with expenditure incurred in this regard

The Department reply as under —

Monitoring of water pollution is carried out on a regular basis by the field offices by taking water samples and testing of the same in water testing laboratories The State has already commissioned sewage treatment plants on majnr cities & towns falling on Yamuna however the matter is regularly pursued with the Public Health Engineering Department Haryana PHED Haryana has already completed 18 sewage treatment plants in 12 towns along the course of river Yamuna in Yamuna Action Plan Phase I under National River Conservation Plan of Government of India at a cost of about Rs 304 50 crores which has helped in substantially containing pollution of river Yamuna in Haryana area In addition to this Haryana has constructed

a length of about 1 56 266 mtr of sewers in 6 towns at a cost of Rs 32 45 crores under Yamuna Action Plan Phase II Haryana has submitted a project amounting to Rs 731 73 crores for augmentation of existing sewage treatment plants of six towns and two additional towns to the National River Conservation Directorate in January 2011 It is further brought to your kind notice that the treated/untreated sewage/effluent is discharged through a number of sewers/drains into the River Yamuna while the River passes through the State of Delhi and as a result the river gets even more polluted As such Haryana again receives highly polluted water in River Yamuna after crossing Delhi which creates numerous problems for use of the water in Haryana for irrigation as well as drinking purposes as the State utilizes Yamuna water through Gurgaon Canal & Agra Canal and the State plans to install Treatment Plants in Faridabad & Nuh districts Haryana Irrigation Department has taken up the matter with the Hon ble Union Finance Minister Govt of India to provide Haryana State Rs 1000 crores for construction of Sewage & Effluent Treatment Plants in the towns through which the River Yamuna passes for conservation and abating pollution of the Yamuna

The issue of pollution of River Ghaggar has been taken up by the Government of Haryana with the Himachal Government which has shown significant improvement in checking of pollution of Ghaggar in Himachal area The matter is also vigorously pursued with the Central Pollution Control Board & Haryana State Pollution Control Board Worthy Financial Commissioner & Principal Secretary to Haryana Govt Irrigation Department convened a meeting of all concerned departments to decide measures to check pollution of Ghaggar As a result HSPCB has issued show cause notices to the Public Health Engineering Department & Municipal Committees of Kaika and Pinjore

Haryana Irrigation Department keeps a close liaison with the HSPCB on a regular basis for pursuing the issue of checking water pollution as the Board is authorized to take penal action against the defaulters under law

After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representatives of the Department **the Committee recommends that the department may raise objection with the H P Government on the issue of polluting water bodies and the Committee may be informed accordingly about the development in this case**
