Constitution of the Committee

The Committee on Estimates for the year 2014 2015 consisting of nine members was nominated by the Hon ble Speaker on having been authorized by a motion moved and passed by the Haryana Vidhan Sabha in its sitting held on 25th February 2014 and notified vide Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat Notification No EC I/2014 15/33 dated 5th May 2014 Rao Dharam Pal MLA a member of the Committee was nominated as Chairperson of the Committee by the Hon ble Speaker which worked upto 27th October 2014 till expiration of 12th Assembly Thereafter after the General Election of 13th Assembly a new Committee for the remaining period of the year 2014 2015 was nominated by the Hon ble Speaker on having been authorized by a motion moved and passed by the Haryana Vidhan Sabha in its sitting held on 4th November 2014 and notified vide Haryana Vidhan Sabha Secretariat Notification No EC 11/2014 15/87 dated 25th November 2014 Shri Krishan Lal Panwar MLA a member of the Committee was nominated as Chairperson of the Committee by the Hon ble Speaker

2 The present Committee held/fixed 15 meetings (at Chandigarh and outside Chandigarh) till the finalization of this Report and previous Committee which was constituted on 5th May 2014 held/fixed 26 meetings during its term

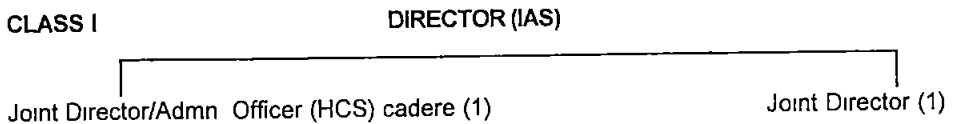
TOURISM DEPARTMENT

1 ORGANIZATION OF DEPARTMENT

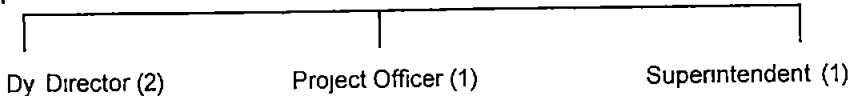
Keeping in view the functions of the Tourism Department the main work of the Department is done at Headquarter level. So far as subordinate offices are concerned the Department has set up two Tourist Information Bureaus one each at Delhi and Kurukshetra which primarily supply information about tourists attractions of the State to the visitors/tourists. A skeleton staff strength of 38 officers/officials has been provided for the functioning of the Department. Organisational Chart of the Department is as under —

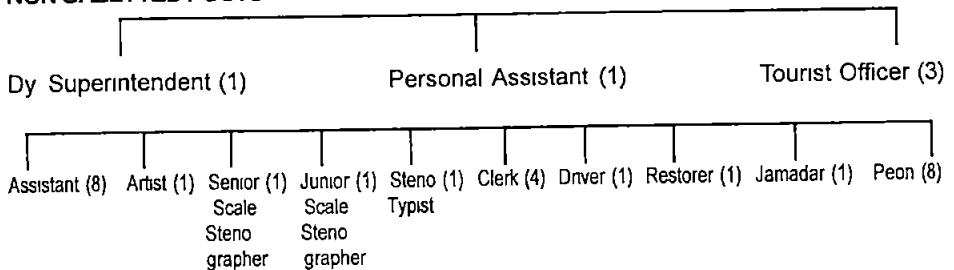

2 FUNCTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT

The primary function of the Tourism Department is to assist the development of tourism infrastructure in the public sector and private sector. The development of tourism infrastructure in the public sector is done by way of funds received from the State Govt. in its annual/five year plans. Once developed and furnished the tourist complexes are handed over to the Haryana Tourism Corporation for their maintenance and operation on behalf of the State Government. The expenditure on the maintenance of infrastructure and horticulture of tourist complexes is also borne by the tourism Department for which funds are provided in the non plan budget every year. Similarly funds are also provided for publicity of the tourism infrastructure of the State. As on date the Department has set up a network of 42 tourist complexes spreading all over the State.

The Tourism Department also encourages the private entrepreneurs to come forward and set up tourism/hotel projects in various parts of the State. The Department has been taking various steps from time to time in facilitating the private entrepreneurs for obtaining various clearances from the concerned agencies of the State Govt. so that maximum possible private investments are made in the tourism sector.

The Department is running four Institutes of Hotel Management at Faridabad, Panipat, Kurukshetra and Rohtak to train manpower for tourism/hotel industry. A new Institute of Hotel Management and Training is being set up at Yamuna Nagar for making appropriate manpower available for the tourism/hotel projects. It is proposed to start this institute from the academic session 2015-16. Five acre land has been allotted to M/s Bharat Hotels Limited, New Delhi for setting up of a Institute of Hotel Management at Badkhal Lake in Public Private Partnership on Long Term Lease of 33 years. The work is in progress. The Government has provided major thrust to Tourism Promotion in the State so that it becomes a major engine of economic growth and a catalyst of employment generation. The Government has announced its Tourism Policy in the year 2008. However, Tourism Department is in the process to prepare the revised scheme of incentives for the entrepreneurs. The State Government has identified 9 new projects for implementation under the PPP mode. The Department has introduced a new concept of promotion of Farm Tourism in the State in under which suitable farms are identified where the tourists are encouraged to visit the farms and see the rural/village life. The owners of the farms act as hosts and guides for the tourists.

3 BROAD DETAILS OF THE ESTIMATES FOR THE YEAR 2013-14

The State Government has allocated an amount of Rs. 2400.00 lacs for the plan outlay for the current financial year 2013-14. It is proposed to provide appropriate funds for completion of on going schemes and to upgrade/modernize the existing tourist facilities so that the same are matching with the latest trends/standards of the hotel industry.

Under the non plan budget the State Government has provided an amount of Rs 298 95 lacs This amount is proposed to be incurred on maintenance of tourism infrastructure and horticulture of the tourist complexes payment of grant in aid to the two Institutes of Hotel Management and incurring establishment/organisational expenditure of the Tourism Department

The Government has provided major thrust to tourism promotion activities in the State Yamuna Nagar Panchkula Paonta Sahib is being developed as an integrated Mega Tourist Circuit which will further increase the tourism potential of the area Central Financial Assistance of Rs 3253 06 lacs has been sanctioned for this project In continuation of its efforts for promotion of convention tourism the Government has allotted 2 acres of land at Red Bishop Tourist Complex Panchkula for setting up a new convention centre Funds amounting to Rs 5 73 crore have been sanctioned by the State Govt for this purpose The construction work of convention centre at Red Bishop Panchkula has been started A sum of Rs 500 00 lacs has been sanctioned by the Ministry of Tourism Govt of India to set up a Multimedia/Laser Show at Tilyar Lake Rohtak

It is also intimated that the posts are not sanctioned complex wise. The requisition for filling up posts of different categories was sent to the HPSC/HSSC. But the HPSE/HSSC asked for providing a copy of service rules of the Corporation so that recruitment could be made. The matter regarding service rules/restructuring of the Corporation is under consideration and is yet to be finalized. As and when the service rules of the Corporation are finalized, the requisition for filling up the posts will be worked out and communicated. However, the requisition for filling up 174 Class IV posts of different categories is being sent to the Government.

- (i) After going through the written reply and oral examination of the representatives of the department, **the Committee desired to know the names of the posts which have been abolished on the recommendations of the Board of Directors together with the names of the new posts, which have been created.**
- (ii) **The Committee further recommends that the vacant posts may be filled up at the earliest so that the work of the department may run smoothly and the Committee may be informed accordingly.**
