REPORT

The Subject Committee on Education, Technical Education Vocational Education, Medical Education and Health Services for the year 2025-2026 consisting of nine members was constituted on 28th April, 2025 and two Special Invitees were nominated by the Hon'ble Speaker vide notification dated 9th June, 2025, under Rule 279-A of the Rules of Procedure & Conduct of Business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly.

The Functions of the Committee are as under: -

- (i) to scrutinize the demands for grants;
- (ii) to examine the working of these departments and to suggest measures for improvements in administration and in different programmes/schemes/projects;
- (iii) to examine legislation;
- (iv) to advice Government on a question of policy or legislation on which Government may consult a Committee;
- (v) to discuss generally and formulate view on-
 - (a) State's Plans and programmes relating to these departments and their implementation;
 - (b) Report of Public Undertaking under these department;
 - (c) Reports of any statutory or other body, including any Commission of Inquiry, which are laid before the House relating to these departments and
 - (d) Annual Performances Reports of these Departments.
- (2) The Subject Committee shall not examine or investigate matters of day-to-day administration.

The Committee held 40 sittings during the year 2025-2026 (till finalization of the Report)

1	<p>In respect of the question no.1, the Committee discussed about the vacancies of Assistant Professors in Universities/ Government Colleges, thereupon, the representative of the department replied that out of total sanctioned post of 8137, 3364 posts have been filled up, 4773 posts are lying vacant and 2095 Guest Lecturer are working presently,therefore, now total 2678 vacancies are left vacant since 2020.The department also explained the reason of pendency of vacancy by stating that due to amendment in the guidelines of the UGC, the service rules were amended and the process of such amendment took a one year, moreover, to settle the roster from the Welfare of Social Justice Empowerment, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Backward Classes & Antyodaya (SEWA) Department, the approval is yet to be get from the Chief Secretary to Govt. Haryana. Colleges, the representative of the department replied that upon the Chief Minister's announcement, the facility of free buses for the girls students of Polytechnic Colleges & Schools was to be given by the Transport Department who was the Nodal Department and the said Department had started the pink buses under the slogan of "BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO" in this regard. But the representative of the department could not replied satisfactorily upon the free bus services either provided or not by the Transport Department. The department could not provide the exact criteria of recruitment, therefore, the Committee recommended to submit the criteria of recruitment duly approved from the – competent authority and made the recruitment accordingly.	Recruitment for Govt. Colleges is made by HPSC which is a constitutional Body/Recruiting Agency and Criteria of recruitment of the Assistant Professor is decided at the Level of HPSC. The Committee after detailed discussion with the Departmental representatives made the following recommendations:

- During the oral examination of the representatives of the transport department, the Committee observed that lack of accessible and affordable transportation remains one of the significant barriers to continued education for girls, particularly in rural and remote areas. Therefore, the recommends the following:
 1. Deployment of dedicated bus services covering all villages, with routes aligned to school and college timings.
 2. Ensuring safety measures such as installation of GPS tracking systems, appointment of trained drivers and conductors, and where feasible, deployment of female staff.
 3. Establishment of proper bus stops and waiting shelters in villages.
- The Committee recommend that all sanctioned vacant posts of teaching and non-teaching staff in State Universities be filled without delay to ensure smooth academic and administrative functioning. The Committee further recommend that necessary steps for expediting the recruitment process in the larger interest of higher education in the State be taken.
- During the oral examination, the departmental representatives has intimated that 45 posts of Principals are to be filled from direct quota for which the process for amendment of rules is underway and after the amendment of rules, the requisition for direct recruitment to the principal will be sent to Haryana Public Service Commission. Therefore, the Committee recommend that process of amendment of the service rules be expedited and the vacant posts be filled up at the earliest.
- During the oral examination, the departmental representatives has intimated that Higher Education Department has sent the requisition to fill up 2424 posts of Assistant Professors in various subjects to HPSC and further intimated that State Government (Higher education Directorate) allowed to fill up 1104 teaching and 1229 no-teaching posts to 10 State Universities. Therefore, the Committee recommend that necessary steps be taken by the department to fill up all the vacant posts at the earliest under intimation to the Committee.
- During the oral examination, the departmental representatives informed that there are 14 government universities in the state out of which 10 are of Higher Education and 4 are of technical education, out of these seven of our universities have been accredited. The departmental representatives also informed that out of 25 private universities 10 universities have been accredited. The department informed that further process of accreditation has been stopped by Government of India. Therefore, the Committee recommend that department should take up this matter with the concerned authorities and necessary steps be taken should be taken to get accreditation of all remaining universities who fulfills all the terms and conditions.

The Committee after detailed discussion with the Departmental representatives made the following recommendations:

- After the oral examination, the Committee recommend that strict instructions be issued to all the empaneled hospitals in the State that they should not refuse treatment to any beneficiary under the Ayushman Scheme under any circumstances and also recommend that a committee of senior officers of department be constituted which will visit the empaneled hospitals across the State and ensure that all the beneficiaries get the benefit of the said insurance scheme and strict action be taken against the management of the hospitals in any kind of lapses are found.
- The Committee also recommend that the department should ensure that ultrasound machines are available in all district hospitals, sub district hospitals and civil hospitals and also appoint trained health professionals for smooth functioning of all the machines.
- During the oral examination, the departmental representatives informed that the proposal for upgradation of 82 Primary health centers is under consideration with the Government. Therefore, the Committee recommend that all the 82 Primary Health Centre pending for upgradation be upgraded as soon as possible. The Committee also recommend that all announcements made by the Chief Minister in this regard be given top priority.

Point No-3, Schemes or Project which the Department has undertaken

Skill strengthening for industrial value Enhancement (STRIVE): -

Directorate General of Training (DGT), Govt. of India, launched scheme namely "Skill Strengthening for Industrial Value Enhancement (STRIVE)" project with World Bank assistance with the objective of improving the relevance and efficiency of skills training provided through ITIs and apprenticeship. STRIVE is 100% Centrally Sponsored project which was started in the State in January 2019. The Outlay of the project is 2200 Crore at national level and allocation for the State of Haryana is approx. 55.00 lakh. From the State of Haryana 21 Govt. and 5 Industry Clusters have been selected. Under this project KPIs have been defined for selected Govt ITIs, ICs and HQ. Till date funds to the tune of 17.94 Crore have been released against which an expenditure of Rs 16.74 Crore has been incurred. This project has been completed on 31.05.2024 and the unspent balance has been returned to the Govt of India.

Up-gradation of 1396 GITIs through PPP: -

Directorate General of Training (DGT), Govt. of India launched a 100% Centrally Sponsored scheme namely 'Up-gradation of 1396 GITIs through PPP' at national level. In the State of Haryana 52 GITIs have being upgraded under the said project. These 52 Govt it is were selected in five selection cycles during 2007-08 to 2011-12. As per guidelines of this scheme the main objective is to upgrade the selected ITIs as per the Institute Development Plan. Interest free loan of Rs 130.00 Crore has been provided to 52 IMC societies of the concerned ITIs (2.5 Crore each ITI). Under this project Interest of Rs 97.03 Crore and Revenue of Rs 17.69 Crore has been earned. The released amount is to be spent on various components i.e. Civil Works, Tools, Equipment & Machinery, Furniture, Books & Learning Material, Additional Manpower, Consumables and Misc. The Project was started in FY 2007-08 and likely to be completed in FY 2041-42. The loan amount is to be repaid in 20 installments @ 12.50 lakh per installment after moratorium period of 10 years. Against available amount an expenditure of Rs 143.52 Crore has been incurred. Further repayment of loan has been started by all concerned Govt. ITI and till now 30.62 Crore has been repaid.

Upgradation of ITI into Model ITI through (Sharing basis) (70:30):-

Directorate General of Training (DGT), Govt. of India launched a Scheme in the year 2016 namely up gradation of existing Govt. Industrial Training Institute into Model ITI. The key objective of this scheme is to develop a benchmark for industry-oriented ITI which would serve as a Model for other ITIs and would also raise dignity of ITI education. Accordingly, Govt. ITI Gurugram has identified in the State of Haryana for up gradation under the scheme. The cost of this project is 10.00 Crore out of which 70% Share will be borne by Central Govt. and 30% Share will be borne by State Govt. Under the scheme, funds to the tune of 9.00 Crore have been released to the concerned institute till now out of which expenditure to the tune of Rs. 6.45 crores has been incurred on Civil Works, M&E, Furniture and Misc by the concerned institute.

The said Project has been closed on 30.09.2024 and the unspent balance has been returned back to Govt. of India.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND INDUSTRIAL TRAINING

The Committee after the detailed discussion with the Departmental representatives made the following recommendations:

Following the oral examination, the Committee recommends that the Department furnish to the Committee detailed quarter-wise information regarding the expenditure incurred under all schemes. The statement should clearly indicate the scheme-wise allocation, expenditure for each quarter, and cumulative expenditure to facilitate effective review and monitoring.

During the oral examination, the Committee observed that the estimated expenditure under the said 'Free Tool Kit Reimbursement Scheme' is shown as Rs. 28693000 (Rs. 1000/- per trainee for 28693 trainees). Therefore, the Committee desire to know the complete stream-wise details of trainees who have been reimbursed the amount of Rs.1000 under the Free Tool Kit reimbursement scheme and also desire to know the details of the students who dropped the courses before completion.

The Committee recommend that all ITI's across the State that are situated below the prescribed ground level be identified through a comprehensive survey. Upon identification, appropriate corrective measures should be undertaken to raise the ground level of such institutions by filling and compacting suitable soil, thereby ensuring proper elevation, improved drainage, and enhanced safety of the campus premises

The Committee seeks to ascertain whether any disbursement of the ₹2,500 scholarship for girls' students and stipends meant for Scheduled Caste and Backward Caste students is presently pending. If so, the detailed information, including the number of beneficiaries affected, category-wise break-up, the amount pending, and the reasons for the delay, be supplied for the consideration of the Committee.

The Committee observed that no Annual Report has been prepared by the Department since the financial year 2018-19. The Committee, therefore, strongly recommend that the Department should prepare all its pending Annual Reports within a period of two months and lay the same on the Table of the House.

SCHOLARSHIP SCHEMES (SECONDARY EDUCATION)

1. CASH AWARD AND MONTHLY STIPEND TO ALL SCHEDULED STUDENTS IN CLASSES 9th TO 12thi) Cash Award Scheme for Scheduled Caste Students I Classes 9th to 12th.

The scheme was introduced in 2008-09 under this scheme Cash Award is given to Scheduled Caste students (Boys & Girls) for purchase of Stationary items, School Bags, Uniform etc. The award is given at following rates:-

Rate per student is 1450/- per annum.

The scheme was introduced in 2024-25 under this scheme One Time Scholarship is given to Scheduled Caste students (Boys & Girls) to Meritorious Students. The award is given at following rates 1,11,000/- to 704 Beneficiaries.

Eligibility Criteria:-

Students belonging to SC Category studying in Haryana Government Schools in Classes 9th to 12th.

ii) Monthly Stipends To All Scheduled Caste Students In Classes 9th-12th

The monthly stipend is disbursed quarterly. The incentive amount is transferred in the students account opened specially for this purpose.

2. RAJIV GANDHI SCHOLARSHIP FOR HIGH/SENIOR SCHOOLS (EEE)

Rajiv Gandhi Scholarship was introduced during the year 2005-06. One student each in boys category and girls category in each school in the 9th to 12th classes who stood first in the preceding class will be awarded. Under the scheme Rs. 1000/- per annum each to the students of High and Senior Secondary classes (9th-12th) are given as incentive/scholarship to encourage brilliant students provided such students have got first division.

In this scheme, a provision of Rs. 195.00 lakh has been made in the financial year 2025-26, which will be borne by the date 31.03.2026.

The Scheme has been revised by the Haryana Govt. w.e.f. session 2014-15 (Exam held in March 2014). Now there is no limit of 700 students and now onwards all the students will get scholarship who obtained the minimum 95% marks and above (irrespective of the Urban & Rural area (Boys & Girls).

In this scheme, a provision of Rs. 45.00 lakh has been made in the financial year 2025-26, which will be borne by the date 31.03.2026.

No expenditure is made as no approval from Finance Department to release the amount is received. This Scheme run by the SCERT Haryana Gurugram.

In this scheme, a provision of Rs. 50.00 Lacs (20.00 Centre Share and 20.00 State Share) has been made in the financial year 2025-26, which will be borne by the date 31.03.2026.

7. MONTHLY STIPEND FOR BPL 9th TO 12th

The objective of the scheme is to provide educational avenues to the students of Below Poverty Line (BPL) category families as well as enhancing the admission & retention of such students for the welfare of BPL category families' students in Haryana Government Schools. To encourage the interest of such students in their study is providing monthly stipend to the students belonging to BPL category studying in Haryana government Schools in Classes 9th to 12th. This scheme was introduced by Government in year 2009-10. Under this scheme monthly stipend is given to all the BPL category students for 12 months and disbursed in 4 quarterly installments at the following rates.

In the scheme only those schedule caste students will be benefited who do not have a High School or a Senior Secondary School in their Village. A budget provision of Rs. 1000.00 Lacs was made for the year 2024-25.

In this scheme, a provision of Rs. 300.00 lakh has been made in the financial year 2025-26, which will be borne by the date 31.03.2026.

11. Mukhyamantri Saksham Scholarship Scheme for Meritorious Students for classes 9th to 12th (New Scheme)

The Mukhyamantri Saksham Scholarship Scheme for Meritorious Students is hereby framed proposes to increase the availability of purely merit based Scholarships for Government School students of classes 6th to 12th in the State of Haryana from the academic session 2020-21. The objective of the Scholarship scheme is to motivate more and more students to become High Achievers in the State, which will be achieved by:

- Making the Scholarship inspirational and encouraging healthy competition among students.
- Increasing the Scholarships available to students and hence, motivate them to obtain this Scholarship. About 10,000 students are covered (i.e. 4500 from 6th to 8th Classes and 5000 from 9th to 12th Classes and 500 after 12th) in this scheme.

Students Selection & Eligibility Criteria and Scholarship Amounts:-

Applications for the Mukhyamantri Saksham Scholarship Scheme for Meritorious Students will open after each academic year on portal.

In this scheme, a provision of Rs. 1.00 lakh has been made in the financial year 2025-26, which will be borne by the date 31.03.2026 for BCA scheme.

12. Re-imbusement of Examination fees of SC students to the Board of School Education, Bhiwani for Board classes: -

This scheme has been introduced during the financial year 2021-22 with the objective to reduce the dropout rate of SC students appearing in board examinations of classes by way of re-imbusement of their Board examination fee directly to the Board of School Education, Haryana, Bhiwani.

In this scheme, a provision of Rs. 4200.00 lakh has been made in the financial year 2025-26, which will be borne by the date 31.03.2026.

13. Re-imbusement of Examination of BC students to the Board of School Education, Bhiwani for Board classes: -

This scheme has been introduced during the financial year 2021-22 with the objective to reduce the dropout rate of BC students appearing in board examinations of classes by way of re-imbusement of their Board examination fee directly to the Board of School Education, Haryana, Bhiwani.

In this scheme, a provision of Rs. 1701.00 lakh has been made in the financial year 2025-26, which will be borne by the date 31.03.2026

14. **Vidyarthi Parivahan Yojna Studying in classes 1st to 12th in classes 9th to 12th and Scheme upgradation on dated 22.12.2023 Students Transport Safety Scheme Class 1st to 12th in State 22 Block as per district and one block.**

This scheme providing class 1st to 12th all students who came to school from other village 1 km above where a govt. High / Sr. Sec. School does not exist. To check dropout rate of the All Students who are studying in 1st to 12th in Govt. Schools. The scheme was introduced during the financial year 2018-19 and the decided to provide free transportation facility only to those girl students, who are studying in classes 9th to 12th for their safety and stipulation of 60% or above monthly attendance. It is also worthwhile to mention here that this facility is to be provided only to those girl students who came to school from other village where a Govt. High / Sr. Sec. School does not exist. To check dropout rate of the Girls Students who are studying in 9th to 12th in Govt. Schools Further, the girl students, who have taken benefit of free bicycle under the scheme Providing Free Bicycle to S.C Students (Boys & Girls) of classes 9th and 11th scheme, will not be entitled for the said benefit under this scheme.

OR

The scheme was introduced during the financial year 2023-24 with the decision to provide the free transportation facility to all students, who are studying in classes 1st to 12th

This scheme providing class 1st to 12th all students who came to school from other village 1 km above where a govt. High / Sr. Sec. School does not exist. To check dropout rate of the All Students who are studying in 1st to 12th in Govt. Schools.

In this scheme, a provision of Rs. 3800.00 lakh has been made in the financial year 2025-26, which will be borne by the date 31.03.2026.

SCHOOL EDUCATION

The Committee after detailed discussion with the Departmental representatives made the following recommendations:

- During the oral examination, the departmental representatives informed that 20% of the teaching posts in PM Shree Schools are vacant and temporary arrangements are being made until the process of filling the vacant posts is completed. Therefore, the Committee recommend that necessary steps be taken to fill up all the vacant posts without any delay. The Committee also recommend that till the regular appointment of teachers is made, adjustment should be made on transfer basis from the Haryana Kaushal Rojgar Nigam so that no student is deprived of the right to education.
- The Committee recommend that all pending civil/construction works related to school buildings across the state should be completed expeditiously and a Committee of Senior Officers be constituted at the Head Quarter Level for proper monitoring of all said civil works and submit its inspection report in every month.
- The Committee recommend that sports nurseries allotted in Government/Private educational institutions should be properly managed in coordination with the Sports Department to develop sports talent at the grassroots level in the State and also recommend that the availability of adequate sports coaches in the said nurseries be ensured.
- The Committee strongly recommend that plantation activities be made a regular and compulsory part of school programs and every school should implement a 'One Student - One Tree' initiative to encourage students to actively participate in tree planning and maintenance.
- The Committee strongly recommend that scholarships and financial incentives be provided to every economically disadvantaged student studying in government schools and funds be transferred directly to beneficiaries to ensure efficiency and accountability. Providing such assistance will promote equal educational opportunities, improve academic performance, and contribute to the overall social and economic development of the nation.
- The Committee recommend that a well-organized and transparent system be established to ensure the timely and proper distribution of textbooks and school uniforms to economically disadvantaged students. Educational materials and uniforms be provided at the beginning of each academic year to prevent disruption in learning and distribution of the said material be monitored by school authorities to ensure fairness and accountability.
- The Committee recommend that the Department should prepare a school-wise/district-wise list which should include the number of school buildings declared dilapidated, schools requiring repairs, schools requiring new buildings and details of schools for which funds have been released or are likely to be released, and submit the same to the Committee at the earliest.
- The departmental representatives informed that students travelling greater than 1 K.M. are provided free travel facility under this scheme and 34986 students have availed the benefits of the scheme. The departmental representatives also informed that out of 38 crores allocated for this scheme, 26.41 crore have been spent. Therefore, the Committee recommend that district-wise data in this regard be supplied to the committee.

The Committee conducted a spot visit to Civil Hospital, Hisar, on 07.06.2025 and after detailed deliberations with the representatives of the Civil Hospital/department, made the following observations/recommendations:

- The Committee recommend that detailed information be provided regarding the procurement of medicines by Civil Hospital, Hisar, including the quantity and value of medicines purchased during the last one year. Further, details may also be furnished regarding the number of patients to whom these medicines were distributed along with ward-wise or department-wise.
- During the visit to the Civil Hospital, Hisar, the representatives of the hospital apprised the Committee that there is a shortage of ambulances which is affecting timely patient transportation, particularly in emergency cases and further informed that the hospital requires a new blood van to strengthen blood collection and transportation services. Additionally, there is an urgent need for a C-ARM machine to facilitate orthopedic operations and improve surgical outcomes. Therefore, the Committee recommend that the Health Department should take necessary and expeditious action to provide the required ambulances, arrange for a new blood van, and install a C-ARM machine at the earliest to enhance healthcare services and ensure better patient care.
- The Committee also recommend that necessary measures be taken to ensure proper cleanliness and sanitation in all Civil Hospitals of the state. Regular monitoring, adequate deployment of sanitation staff, and strict adherence to hygiene protocols may be ensured to maintain a clean and healthy environment for patients, attendants, and healthcare personnel.

The Committee conducted a spot visit to J C Bose University of Science and Technology, Faridabad, on 11.07.2025 and after detailed deliberations with the representatives of the University/department, made the following observations/recommendations:

- During the oral examination of the representatives of J.C. Bose University of Science and Technology, the Committee raised several queries regarding key administrative and academic issues. These included:
 - Shortage of faculty members.
 - Implementation of the reservation policy in appointments to regular vacancies, contractual appointments, and promotions.
 - Low pass percentage and related academic concerns.
 - Status of campus placements.
 - Hostel facilities provided to students.
 - Status of construction of the additional campus on the 18 acres of allotted land.
- The representatives of the University responded to each query and presented the current status through a detailed presentation. However, the Committee expressed dissatisfaction with the slow pace of recruitment and the progress on other related matters.
- The Committee observed that the University administration has not taken adequate cognizance of the shortage of faculty, resulting in adverse effects on the academic interests and careers of the students. Although the Vice-Chancellor attempted to justify the deficiencies by explaining the reasons for delays in specific matters, the Committee did not find the explanations satisfactory.
- Accordingly, the Committee recommend that the University undertake an immediate and comprehensive review of the issues raised and submit an Action Taken Report to the Committee within three months.

The Committee conducted a spot visit to Kalpana Chawla Medical College, Karnal, on 25.07.2025 and, after detailed deliberations with the representatives of the Medical College/department, made the following observations/recommendations:

- During the oral examination, the Committee observed that Kalpana Chawla Medical College, Karnal had utilized only 20–25% of the allocated budget for medicines, equipment, and related items during the financial years 2022–23 and 2023–24. Therefore, the Committee expressed serious concern over the underutilization of funds during the said period.

Accordingly, the Committee recommend that the reasons for spending only 20–25% of the allocated budget during the financial years 2022–23 and 2023–24 be furnished to the Committee. Further, the updated status of budget allocation and expenditure for the financial years 2024–25 and 2025–26 may also be provided for review.

- During the oral examination, the Committee observed with concern that not even a single Neurosurgeon or Cardiologist was available at Medical College. The absence of these specialists is likely to adversely affect patient care and the quality of medical services being provided by the institution.

Accordingly, the Committee strongly recommend that the appointments of a Neurosurgeon and Cardiologists be made at the earliest to ensure the availability of essential specialized medical services.

- During the oral examination, it came to the notice of the Committee that an individual, previously terminated in the year 1994 has been appointed to the post of Assistant Professor. It was also noted that the individual had disclosed this termination in his application form. The Committee expressed serious concern over how such an appointment could have been made despite this prior termination.

Accordingly, the Committee recommend that the Director, Medical Education take cognizance of the matter and conduct a thorough enquiry. A detailed report on the findings of the enquiry be submitted to the Committee within 15 days positively.

- In the year 2023, the Committee had recommended that the entire record of blood donors be made available online. However, it has been observed with serious concern that the Department has failed to implement this directive.

The Committee strongly directs that the complete data of blood donors be immediately uploaded and made fully accessible online. Strict compliance is expected and the Department is required to report the status of implementation to the Committee without any further delay.

- During the oral examination, it came to the notice of the Committee that during the construction of the medical college, a significant quantity of soil was excavated and there are reports that this soil has been misappropriated. Therefore, the Committee recommend that a thorough fact-finding enquiry be conducted and a detailed report on the findings be submitted to the Committee within 15 days positively.

The Committee conducted a spot visit to Bhagat Phool Singh Government Medical College for Women, Khanpur Kalan, Sonipat, on 11.09.2025 and after detailed deliberations with the representatives of the Medical College/department made the following observations/recommendations:

- With regard to the centralized air-conditioning system of the Library, the Committee recommend that the officials responsible for the negligence be identified and held accountable, appropriate action be taken against them, and the system be restored and made fully functional within a period of six months. On this issue, the Director of Medical Education assured that a departmental committee comprising engineers would be constituted to conduct a detailed survey and assess the situation. Additionally, the Committee recommend that an Engineering Wing be established in the Medical College, comprising representatives from Public Health, PWD, Electrical, and other relevant departments, to ensure proper maintenance and timely resolution of infrastructure-related issues in the future.
- With regard to the purchase of a higher-capacity ultrasound machine, the Director of BPS Medical College informed the Committee that a proposal for procurement of the said machine has already been submitted to the Government for approval. Therefore, the Committee recommend that the matter be taken up again with the concerned Department to ensure early approval and that the procurement process be expedited at the earliest in the interest of patient care and institutional requirements.
- The Committee recommend that the 86 vacant posts of Doctors/Faculty, including the vacant posts of Cardiologists and Neurosurgeons, be filled within a period of one month. The Committee also recommend that the efforts and action taken by the Department in this regard be communicated to the Committee within the stipulated timeframe.
- The Committee observed that the Medical College is facing significant issues relating to electricity, sewerage, and stormwater drainage systems. The Committee recommend that the Medical College Administration/Department take immediate and effective steps to address and resolve these issues at the earliest. The Committee further noted that the internal roads of the College are in poor condition, resulting in waterlogging. Accordingly, the Committee recommend that the road levels be raised and necessary repairs be undertaken to ensure proper drainage and prevent accumulation of water.
- The Committee observed that referral of patients suffering from diseases for which the requisite specialists or facilities are not available in the Medical College is justified. However, it was noted that patients suffering from diseases that could be treated within the Medical College were also referred elsewhere. In view of the above, the Committee recommend that detailed reasons for such referrals be compiled and submitted to the Committee at the earliest for review.
- The Committee expressed concern regarding the security arrangements in the Girls' Hostel of the Medical College. Therefore, the Committee recommend that adequate and foolproof security measures be ensured to safeguard the safety and well-being of the resident students.

The Committee further recommended that proper deployment of trained security personnel, installation of functional CCTV cameras at strategic locations, maintenance of entry and exit registers, and provision of adequate lighting in and around the hostel premises be ensured. Regular monitoring and periodic review of the security arrangements should also be undertaken to prevent any untoward incidents.

The Action Taken Report in this regard be submitted to the Committee at the earliest.

The Committee conducted a spot visit to Deenbandhu Chhotu Ram University of Science and Technology (DCRUST), Murthal, Sonipat, on 12.09.2025 and after detailed deliberations with the representatives of the University / department, made the following observations/recommendations:

- The Committee observed that the international-standard swimming pool constructed on the University campus has not been made operational due to the absence of requisite administrative approval from the Government.
In view of the above, the Committee recommend that a detailed and comprehensive report outlining the reasons for the delay, the present status of the matter, and the steps taken to obtain the necessary approval be submitted to the Committee at the earliest.
The Committee also recommend that responsibility be fixed on the officers/officials concerned who failed to secure timely Government approval for the execution of the work and that appropriate action be initiated against those found negligent.
- The Committee observed that other Universities are disbursing salaries to Guest Faculty in accordance with the recommendations of the Seventh Pay Commission. The Committee is of the view that the authorities of the Deenbandhu Chhotu Ram University of Science and Technology (DCRUST) should also ensure payment of salaries to all Guest Faculty on the same basis.
Accordingly, the Committee recommend that the matter be examined expeditiously and that appropriate action be taken at the earliest to ensure compliance.
- The Committee observed that there has been a recurring delay in the issuance of identity cards to students. The Committee, therefore, recommend that in future, identity cards be issued to all students at the commencement of the academic session on a priority basis to avoid inconvenience and ensure smooth functioning of academic and administrative activities.
- The Committee observed that several development projects initiated on the University campus remain incomplete despite the substantial investment of funds. These include, inter alia, the construction of the swimming pool, the Architect's Building and the classroom complex proposed under RUSA. The Committee expressed concern that public funds have been invested in these projects, yet they are still pending for completion.
Accordingly, the Committee recommend that the University authorities identify and address the hurdles causing the delay and take all necessary steps to ensure the expeditious completion of these projects.
- The Committee recommend that all statutory Councils of the University be constituted strictly in accordance with the provisions of the Act and that their functioning be carried out in full compliance with the said provisions.
The Committee further recommend that any irregularities in the constitution of the Executive Council and the Academic Council be rectified forthwith. It also

emphasized that due care be taken in future to ensure that no such procedural lapses or deviations from the Act occur again.

- The Committee recommend that the RO water purifiers installed in the Institute be inspected, serviced, and repaired on a regular basis to ensure the continuous availability of clean and safe drinking water for students and faculty members.

The Committee further recommend that an Environmental Committee of the University comprising three to four members should be constituted to monitor the maintenance and protection of planted trees and to promote further plantation of new saplings on the campus.

The Committee also recommend that healthy refreshments and proper uniforms be provided to the children studying at Sarovar School located within the campus premises. Additionally, the Committee directed the University authorities to address and resolve all pending matters within a period of two months.

The Committee conducted a spot visit to PGIMS, Rohtak, on 05.02.2026 and after detailed deliberations with the representatives of the PGIMS/department, made the following observations/recommendations:

- The Committee recommend that necessary action be taken on priority to expedite the process of filling up all vacant posts of Assistant Professors, Senior Residents/Demonstrators/Tutors, as well as Technical, Non-Technical and Nursing Staff in PGIMS, Rohtak, so as to ensure the smooth and efficient functioning of the institute.
- The Committee observed that the withdrawal of the University's power to recruit staff has caused significant harm. Therefore, the Committee recommend that the University be granted the authority to recruit doctors, nurses, and other staff, as was the practice earlier, in order to ensure the smooth and efficient functioning of the institution.
- The Committee observed that some promotion cases of doctors have been pending since 2024. Therefore, the Committee recommend that all doctors of PGIMS, Rohtak, who fulfill the prescribed conditions for promotion be promoted at the earliest. The action taken in this regard be also intimated to the Committee.
- The Committee observed that the construction of the Central Library on campus is still pending completion. Therefore, the Committee recommend that the construction work of the library be expedited to enable students to avail the facilities at the earliest.
- The Committee observed that PGIMS, Rohtak, is facing a significant issue regarding budget availability. Therefore, the Committee recommend that the Institute take up the matter vigorously with the Finance Department to ensure timely and adequate provision of the budget.
